Whaea Emma has been a kaiawhina in Rūma Rima and although she is going to leave to welcome her new arrival, we are going to miss you dearly.





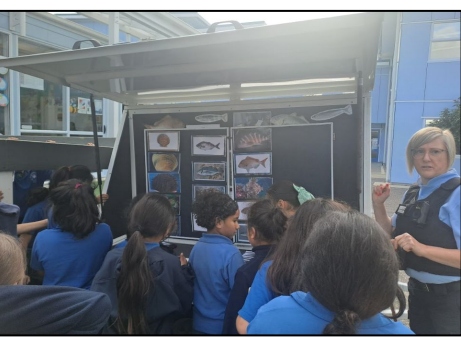
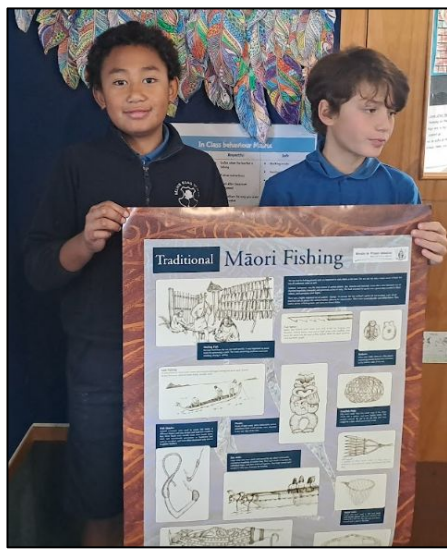
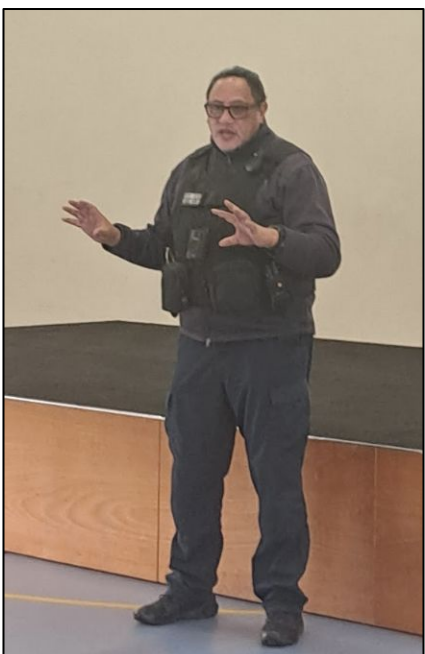

Te Tautiaki i nga tini a Tangaroa



On Wednesday we were lucky to have some amazing fishery officers visit our school to teach students in the Middle School and Te Whatitoka about ocean sustainability which ties into our topic of Tangaroa. They shared their knowledge about Tangaroa and demonstrated their roles through interactive sessions that engaged and inspired our tamariki.

The officers showcased their safety uniforms and explained fishing rules in New Zealand, emphasizing responsible practices to protect marine life. Students also learned about different types of fish we can find in Auckland waters, enhancing their understanding of our marine ecosystem.

A highlight was appointing each student as a junior fishery officer, which filled them with pride and a sense of responsibility towards protecting our oceans.
